Chair Eric Lundin called the meeting to order at 4:07 p.m. ET.

#### 1) Athletics Annual Update presented by Matt Johnson, Athletic Director

Matt Johnson presented an update on the Athletic department that included information on the sport offerings, team roster sizes, where student athletes transfer to play their sport, and financials.

Matt added that an economic impact study should be considered to learn the value to the community that Norse Athletics generates. There is a minimum of 50 nights that visiting teams stay in the area that include families and fans spending money in the community, in addition to what student athletes from outside Delta County spend.

The cultural diversity that Norse Athletics has brought to the College and the community has also been a benefit. The number of international students has increased due to the athletic program and also enhances our learning community.

Terri Mileski asked if there was more information on the cost of indirect expenses that were not available in the presentation. Indirect expenses include academic associated expenses, facility expenses, and the cost of services provided to the program from across campus. Indirect costs are not identified for any of the programs throughout the College so Athletics is no different. Ideally, these costs will be able to be identified in the future.

Terri also requested the day-to-day operating cost of the Physical Education Center. This will change when the pool moves to the YMCA building and the cost of renovation for that space is determined.

Amber Kinonen left the meeting and Joseph Mold entered the meeting at 4:30 p.m.

Amy Reddinger entered the meeting at 4:33 p.m.

Dr. Hughes responded to Terri's question that the number of athletes that receive Pell Grant is 31%.

Tom Butch extended congratulations to Matt Johnson, the other coaches, and all involved in Athletics. The program has been wonderful for the students and a definite benefit to the College.

Eric Lundin added that his interactions with student athletes in the community has been great and lends to what they bring to the community as that helps our college and community.

Dr. Hughes responded to Nick Chenier's question that 21.5% of student athletes are from Delta County.

Dr. Hughes added that Athletics is a true value add to the College. Much of our full-time enrollment is from Athletics and this would be different without Athletics. Terri responded that what Bay could offer to the community is most important.

#### 2) Online Learning Data presented by Joseph Mold, Exec. Dir. of Online Learning

Joseph Mold presented historical data comparisons on Online Learning including course success, course modality offerings and enrollment, certification of instructors, tools used within online learning, textbook savings to students of ~\$2.5 million since 2016-2017, and the transition timeline to Blackboard Ultra, the learning management system upgrade that will provide an updated look and consistent design for online course delivery.

Eric Lundin thanked Joseph and the Online Learning staff for their work before the pandemic which made our transition to online delivery very smooth compared to other schools and throughout the pandemic to ensure students and instructors were supported. Eric added that Bay is doing great things online.

Terri added that her experience assisting students with Bay's online courses is great compared to other schools and she appreciates the improvements always made to move Bay forward.

Discussion indicated interest in finding the right balance between offering online and face-to-face courses and the benefits of each. Joseph added that in the best case, a mixture of both online and face-to-face would be offered, giving students an option to attend class either in person or online. Additionally, all classes should include a digital component with information shared with students in Blackboard (the learning management system.)











# Course Success Comparing All Students to Online Students




# Course Increase by Modality












# Blackboard Ally Scores Over Time

(accessibility of files and courses over time)





# Online Learning Orientation Completions Over Time




